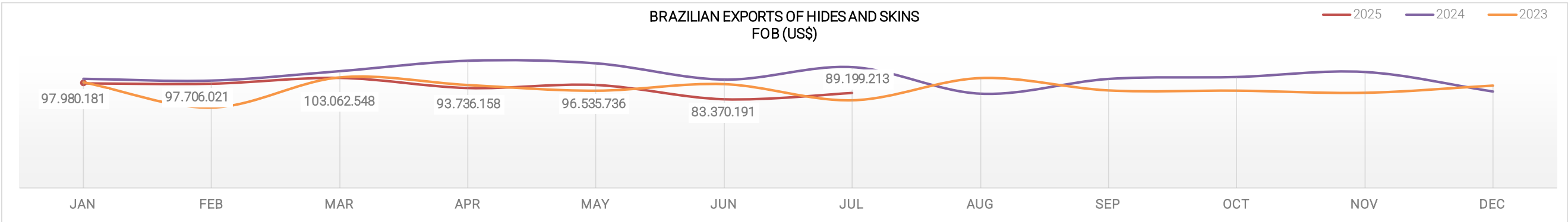
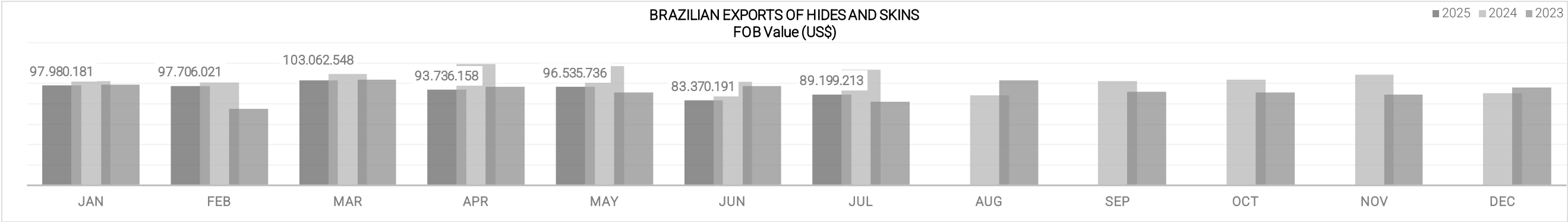

■ ANALYSIS OF TOTAL EXPORTS

Exports of hides and skins in July 2025, according to data from SECEX (Secretariat of Foreign Trade) of the Ministry of Development, Industry, Commerce and Services and analyzed by CICB, reached US\$ 89.2 million.

This value represents a positive change of 7.0% compared to the previous month, but a decrease of 21.1% compared to the same period last year, when exports totaled US\$ 113.1 million.

In volume, 14.2 million square meters and 45.3 thousand tons were exported, which represent decreases of 14.5% and 3.2%, respectively, compared to July 2024. Compared to June of this year, there were increases of 6.2% in the area and 12.4% in weight.

The period from January to July this year totaled US\$ 661.6 million, 13.2% below the same interval in 2024, also with a decrease of 6.3% in area, but an increase of 2.0% in weight.

■ ANALYSIS OF DESTINATIONS

The three main destinations for Brazilian leather presented the following data in the seven-month period:

China (excluding Hong Kong) has a share of 29.7% (previously 29.6%) in value and 44.0% (43.7%) in area, down 15.5% (-12.7%) in value, but still up 2.0% (+3.6%) in area.

The United States is in second place in the ranking, with 14.3% (13.6%) of share in value and 7.2% (6.9%) in area, with a decrease of 10.7% (-10.6%) in value and 4.8% (-3.4%) in area.

Italy in third, with a share of 11.1% (12.3%) in value and 13.0% (14.3%) in area, has decreases of 16.3% (-13.2%) in value and 5.8% (-3.0%) in area.

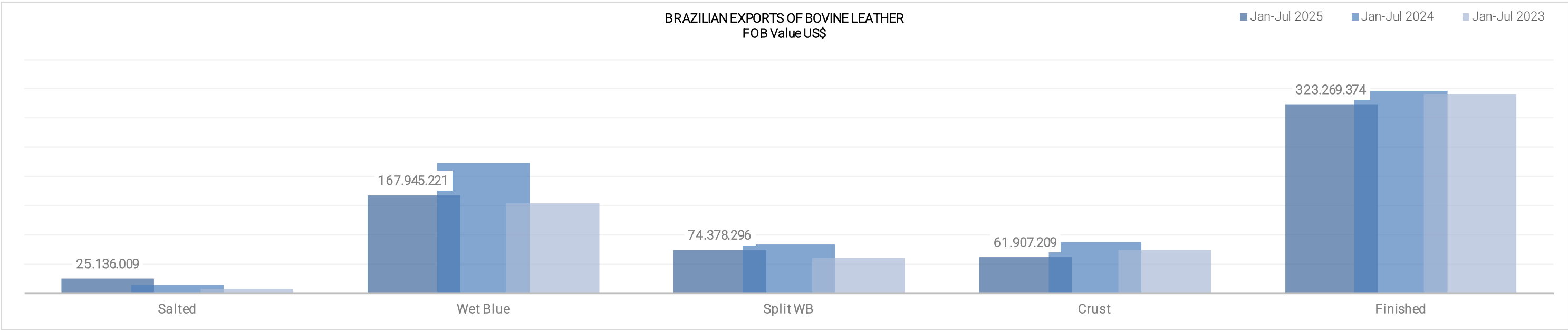
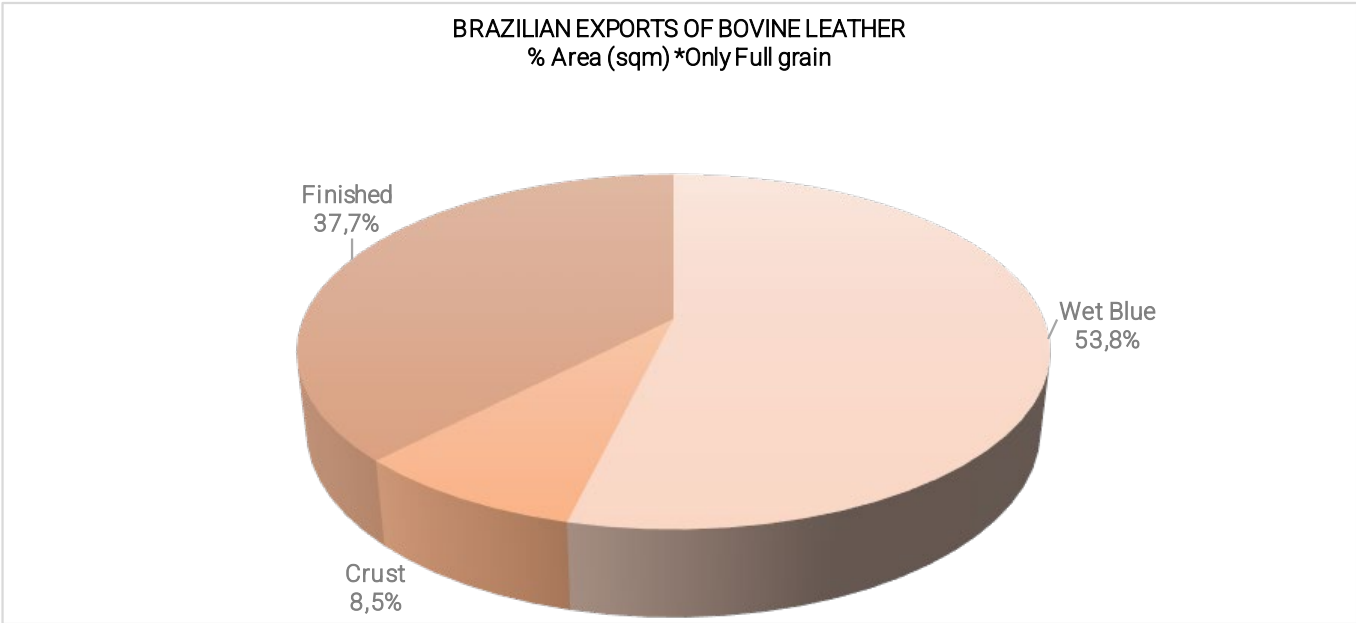
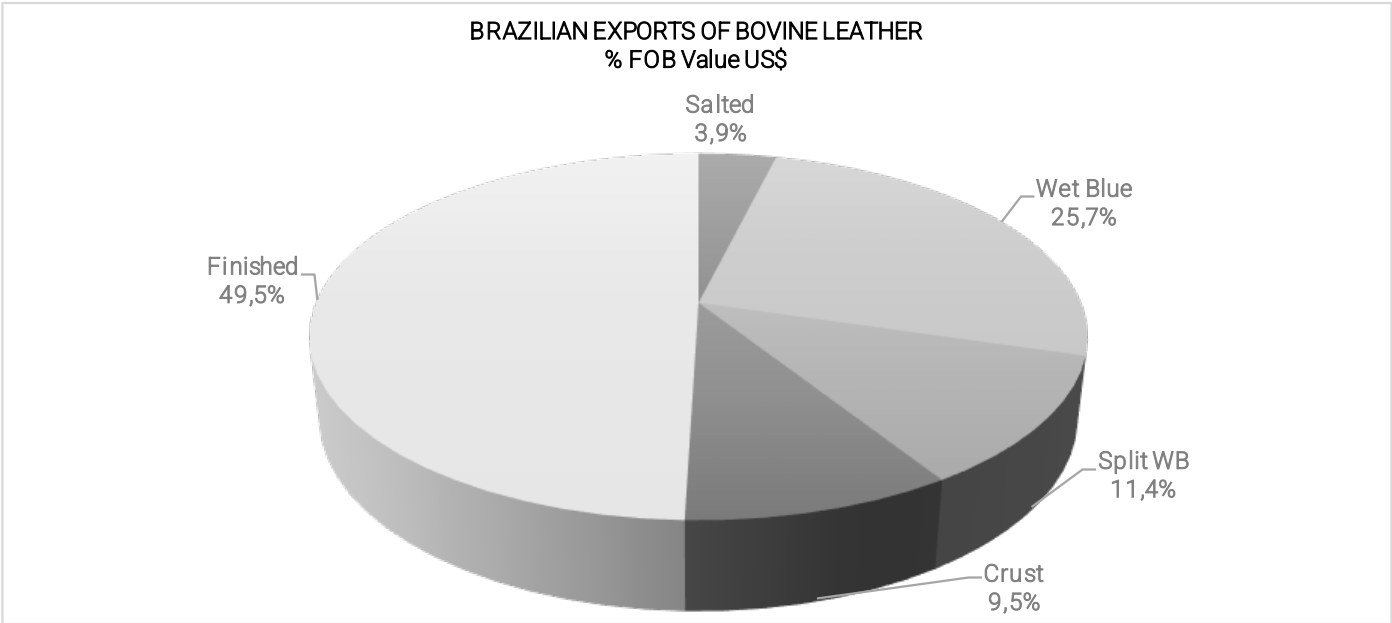
In this month, not even shipments to the United States were saved, with generalized drops in the three main destinations for national leather.

As the worsening of exports was more abrupt to China and Italy, the North Americans recorded a slight improvement in the share in the total value and area, even with the register of worsening in the annual comparative indexes.

Among the other TOP10 countries, the highlights continue to be leather exports to Spain (+64.8% in value and +64.3% in area) and to South Korea (+40.9% in value and +49.3% in area).

■ ANALYSIS OF TYPES OF LEATHER

Brazilian exports of bovine leather by type showed the following changes in the first seven months of the year, compared to the same interval of the previous year:

Wet blue, with a share of 25.7% (25.9%) in value and 53.8% (53.9%) in area, with decreases of 24.8% (-25.3%) in value and 2.9% (-3.0%) in area.

Split WB maintains 11.4% (11.4%) of share in value, with decreases of 10.7% (-7.5%) in value and 14.0% (-12.5%) in area.

Crust, with a share of 9.5% (9.4%) in value and 8.5% (8.3%) in area, shows reductions of 29.0% (-28.1%) in value and 22.3% (-21.7%) in area.

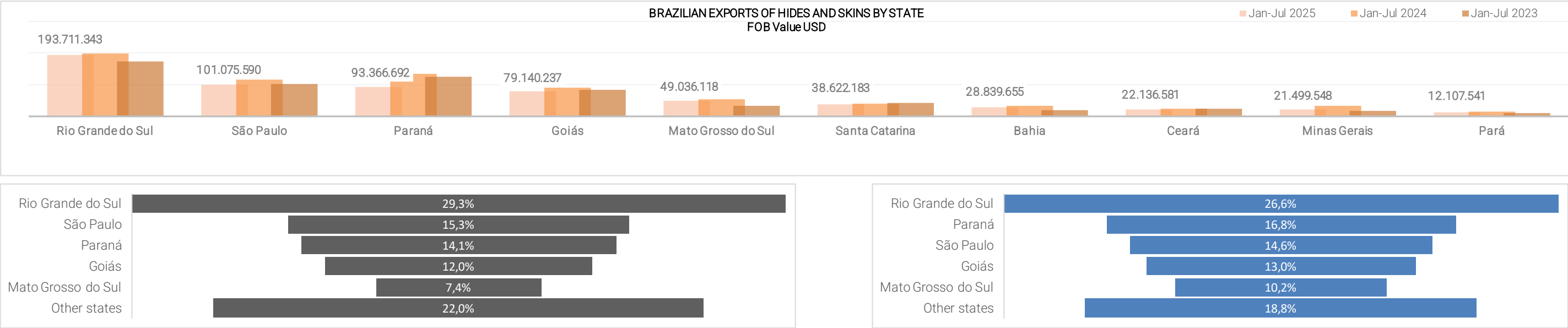
Finished leather maintains a share of 49.5% (49.5%) in value and 37.7% (37.7%) in area, has a decrease of 6.8% (-4.4%), but still an increase of 0.1% (+3.7%) in area.

Among the two types of leathers with the largest share in the total - wet blue and finished -, the biggest reduction in volume was in the finished leather, with a drop of 18.5% in area compared to the same month last year. Wet blue was practically stable in area, but with the average exported price still below US\$ 4.00 per sqm, it also caused the total value to drop by 20.0%.

After three consecutive months of declines in the volumes shipped of salted hides in the monthly comparison, we have another increase in July, exceeding 7 thousand tons.

■ ANALYSIS OF STATES

Exports from Brazilian states presented the following highlights within the period:

Among the TOP10, now all states have monetary drops in year-to-date shipments. Rio Grande do Sul and Santa Catarina still register the best performance, remaining close to stability.

Considering the area shipped, there were increases in Mato Grosso do Sul (+4.0%), Santa Catarina (+3.1%), Goiás (+1.4%), Pará (+1.0%) and Rio Grande do Sul (+0.4%).

The ranking of the states ended the period with Rio Grande do Sul in first place in value, with a 29.3% share, followed by São Paulo (15.3%), Paraná (14.1%) and Goiás (12.0%).

In terms of shipped area, RS also leads with 26.6%, but Paraná is in second place, with 16.8% share, followed by São Paulo (14.6%) and Goiás (13.0%).

■ CLOSING REMARKS

Despite the growth compared to the previous month, July registered decreases in the annual comparison, which accentuated the retraction of exports accumulated in the year. There is now an increase only in the exported weight, with a positive change of 2.0%, while monetary values fell 13.2% and the exported area decreased by 6.3%.

When analyzing the three main markets, shipments to the United States were the only ones that had been maintaining consistent performance in recent months, signaling a possible recovery capable of neutralizing the deficit in exports to that destination and even allowing the projection of a positive balance at the end of the year.

However, the recent imposition of tariffs on a large part of the Brazilian export agenda – including hides and skins – with an absurd rate of 50% import tax, is already beginning to negatively impact the sector.

This month, there have already been reflections on shipments, with suspensions and even cancellations of orders by North American customers.

In addition to the measures imposed on Brazil, the impasse between the two largest economies in the world – China and the United States – still persists, paralyzing a significant portion of the business linked to the leather sector. The deadline for reaching an understanding now ends in August, but there is still no clarity on how the differences will be handled or whether it will be possible to sign a mutually advantageous agreement.

We remain confident that the Brazilian government, in conjunction with the leaders of the most affected sectors – with the constant action of the CICB – will continue to be committed to seeking a negotiated solution with the United States that meets the interests of the country. -
