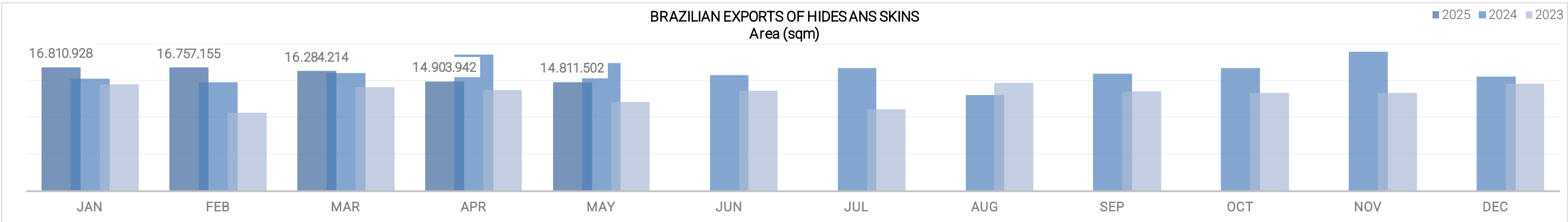
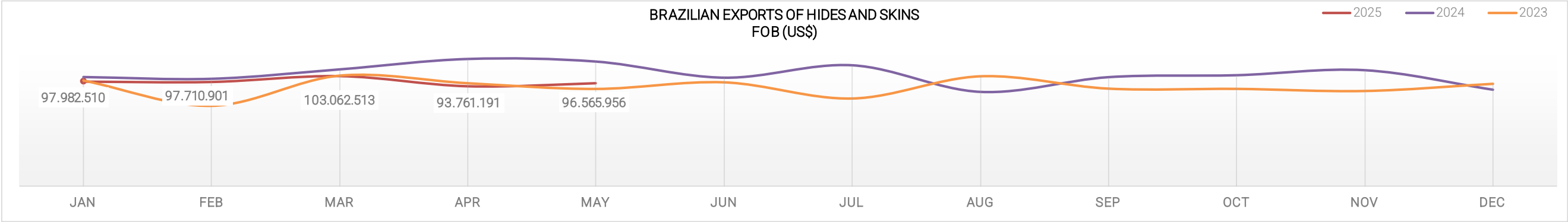

■ ANALYSIS OF TOTAL EXPORTS

Exports of hides and skins, according to data from SECEX (Secretariat of Foreign Trade) of the Ministry of Development, Industry, Commerce and Services and analyzed by the CIGB, reached US\$ 96.6 million in May 2025.

This value represents an increase of 3.0% compared to the previous month, but a decrease of 17.2% compared to the same period last year, when exports totaled US\$ 116.6 million.

Considering volume, 14.8 million square meters and 45.0 thousand tons were exported, which represent reductions of 14.5% and 14.9%, respectively, compared to May 2024. Compared to April this year, there were decreases of 0.6% in the area and 5.7% in weight.

The five-month interval of the year totaled US\$ 489.1 million, 10.7% below the same period in 2024, also with a decrease of 2.9% in area, but an increase of 6.9% in weight.

■ ANALYSIS OF DESTINATIONS

The three main destinations for Brazilian leather presented the following data in the year:

China (excluding Hong Kong) has a share of 29.9% (previously 31.1%) in value and 44.1% (45.5%) in area, with a decrease of 11.1% (-5.8%) in value and an increase of 6.1% (+12.8%) in area.

The United States is in second place in the ranking, with 13.7% (13.1%) of share in value and 6.9% (6.4%) in area, with a decrease of 11.6% (-13.9%) in value and 3.9% (-8.9%) in area.

Italy in third, with a share of 12.8% (13.0%) in value and 14.8% (15.2%) in area, now has a drop of 5.2% (+2.9%) in value, but an increase of 5.5% (+16.4%) in area.

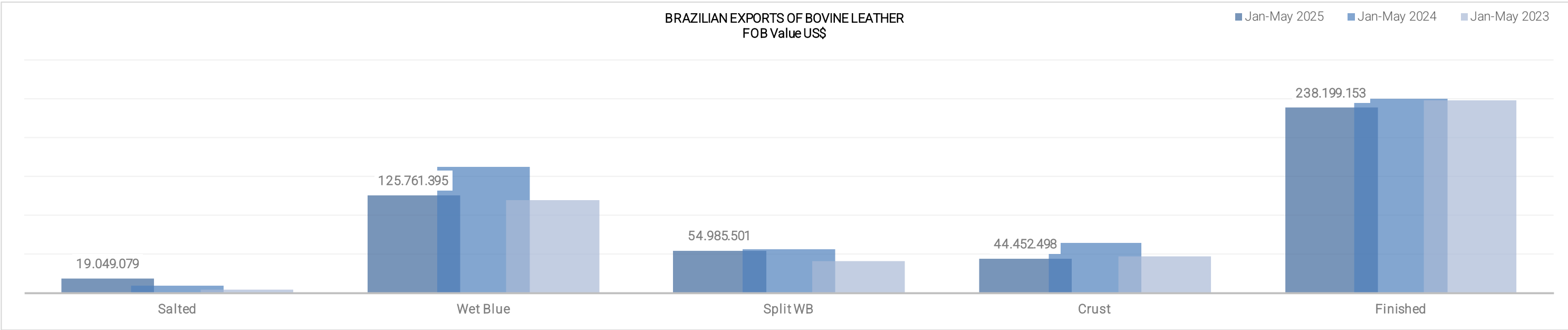
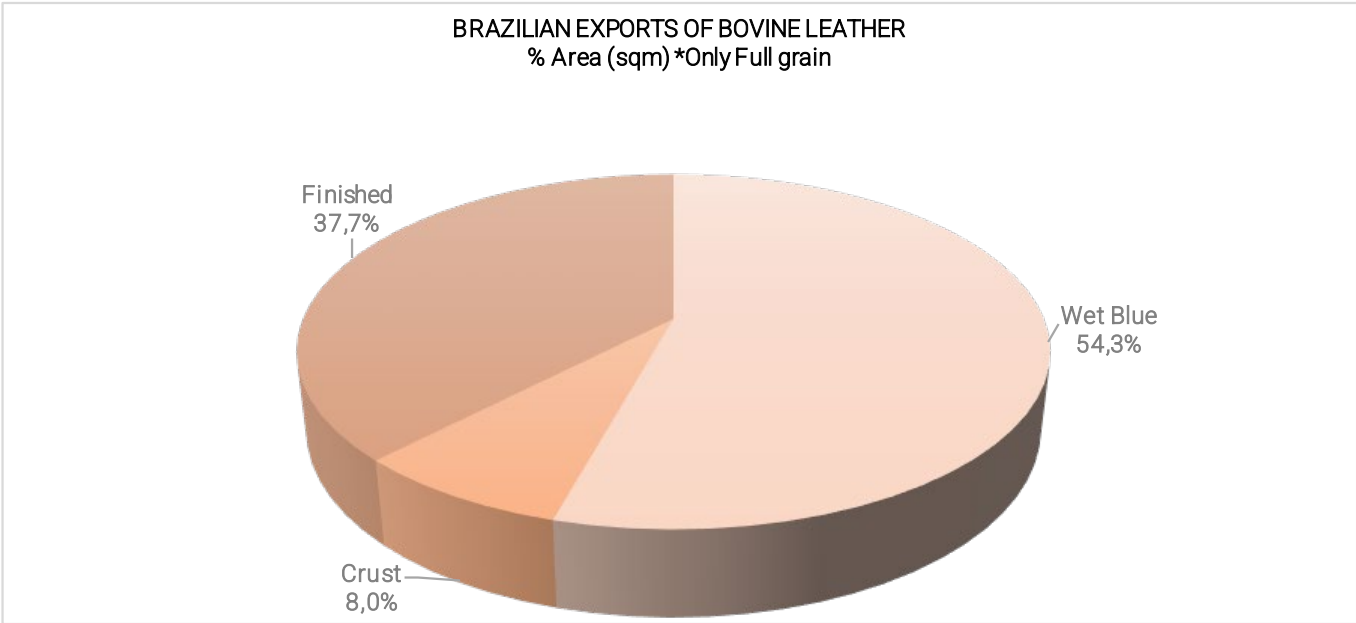
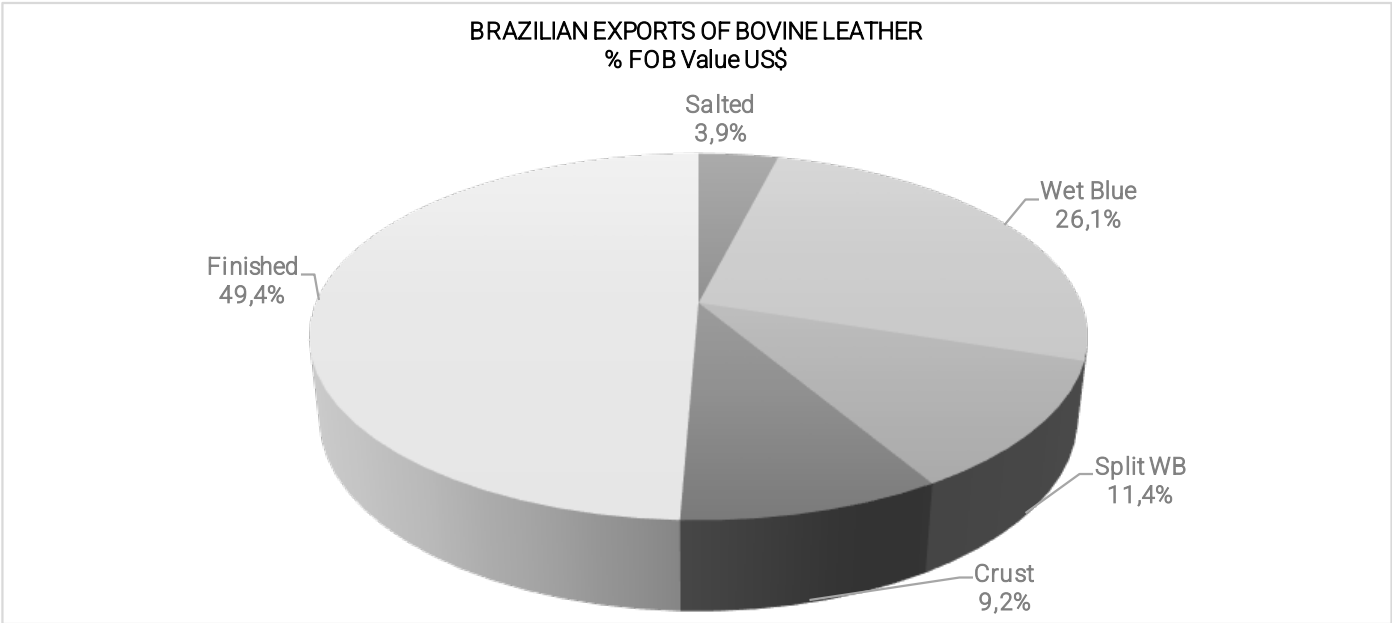
For the second consecutive month, there was an improvement only in the indicators of exports to the United States. China and Italy again registered difficulties, with worsening in participation and annual comparative indexes.

However, for China and Italy we still have growth in shipments in volumes. The US, on the other hand, continues to show a drop in values and volumes.

Among the other TOP10 countries, there is growth in leather exports to South Korea (+17.1% in value and +21.9% in area) and Norway (+16.5% in value and +15.9% in area). Spain, in 11th place, also has a significant increase of +88.0% in value and +65.1% in area.

■ ANALYSIS OF TYPES OF LEATHER

Brazilian exports of bovine leather by type showed the following changes in the first five months of 2025, compared to the same interval of the previous year:

Wet blue, with a share of 26.1% (27.4%) in value and 54.3% (56.2%) in area, with decreases of 22.3% (-14.4%) in value and an increase of 0.5% (+9.9%) in area.

Split WB, with 11.4% (11.1%) of participation in value, shows decreases of 3.3% (-5.0%) in value and 9.8% (10.5%) in area.

Crust, with a share of 9.2% (9.8%) in value and 8.0% (8.3%) in area, shows reductions of 31.1% (-26.5%) in value and 24.8% (-18.9%) in area.

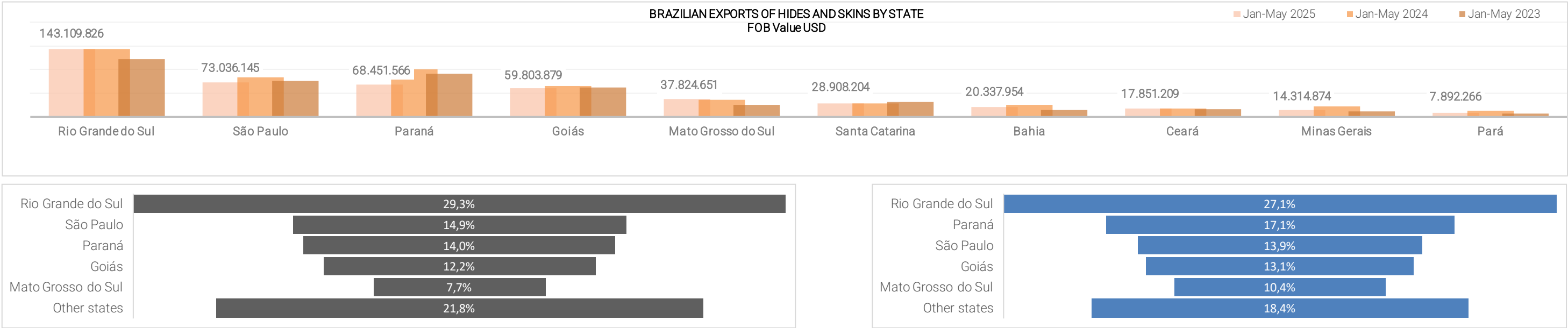
Finished leather, with a share of 49.4% (47.7%) in value and 37.7% (35.6%) in area, fell 4.5% (-6.9%), but increased 4.1% (+0.9%) in area.

While wet blue decreases its share in total exports, finished leather improves and is approaching stabilization

Although salted hides decreased the average of shipments in the last two months compared to the first quarter, they still continue at a high pace and double the value of the same month last year.

■ ANALYSIS OF STATES

During the accumulated interval of the year, the exports of the Brazilian states presented the following highlights:

Among the top 10, Mato Grosso do Sul continues with the best performance, with +7.0%, while Pará reaches a reduction of 37.4%. The states of Santa Catarina, with +3.7%, and Ceará, with +2.5%, also remain at positive levels.

Regarding the area shipped, we have double-digit increases in Mato Grosso do Sul, with +21.8%, and Santa Catarina with +15.1%. Other states with a positive performance in area are Goiás (+8.1%), Rio Grande do Sul (+2.8%) and Ceará (+1.7%).

The state of Mato Grosso, in the 11th position in the ranking, deserves to be highlighted for the growth of 12.0% in value and 32.3% in area.

The ranking of the states now shows Rio Grande do Sul in first place in the three indexes: 29.3% share in value, 27.1% in area and 18.2% in weight. São Paulo, with 14.9% in value, returns to second place, surpassing Paraná, which is in third, with 14.0% share. In area, Paraná follows in second in the ranking, with 17.1% against 13.9% in São Paulo. In fourth place is Goiás, with 12.2% in value and 13.1% in area.

■ CLOSING REMARKS

The tariff war that began in April continues to negatively affect Brazilian leather exports, especially in shipments to China and Italy, the main buyer market in Europe.

Although the cumulative performance in the year is still negative, there was a recovery in sales to the United States in May. In that month, the volume exported to the North American market grew 11.8% compared to the same period of the previous year.

With regard to the types of leather exported, wet blue has been losing share in total sales, while finished leather has shown progress, contributing to sustain, at least in part, the volumes and values exported. In May, more than 5.1 million square meters of finished leather were exported — the best monthly result since October 2021.

Tariff disputes, instability and geopolitical tensions continue to influence the international scenario, directly affecting the purchasing behavior of Chinese customers, who continue to press for lower prices to place their orders. Despite this, there have been positive signs recently, with the suspension of the additional tariffs imposed by the United States for a period of 90 days, which brought some temporary relief to the market. However, the concrete effects of this measure should only be felt later, being reflected in future shipments.

Considering that, since the beginning of the trade war, uncertainties have only intensified, the road to resolving this conflict between the world's two largest economic powers tends to be long, full of challenges and unpredictable events. -
